The village Jarapara has adopted by Jawaharlal Nehru College, Boko to uplift and the encourage the villagers. The village is just 100 meters far from the college campus. The village is inhabited by the Rabha people. The village is situated nearby NH. 17. In the village there is only one lower primary school and one Angana wadi center for Child development. Beside this there is also one Mahila Samittee. The Mahila Samittee and J. N. College.

The NSS Unit of J.N. College, Boko adopted the same village for the period of three years. The NSS Unit of J.N. College, Boko organized various activates inside the adopted village along with villagers. Activates like village cleanliness drive, AIDS awareness program, Posturing against alcoholism, Swachata Bhatat Abhijan, etc. Beside these the NSS Unit donated a modern sanitation system to Jarapar Mahila Samittee , the total cost was 43,500. Beside these, during the time of Corona Pandemic our NSS Unit conducted numbers Covid-19 Rapid test among the villagers and conducting 14 Covid-19 vaccination camp at college campus for villagers of adopted village.

The department of Anthropology conduct various activities like the cleanliness drive and organized free health check up and organized community free plantation program and planted different types of valuable plants around the houses and lands. The school dropout students of the adopted village are being called for counseling and they are encouraged to peruse skilled vocational course either in any collage.

The program like international Women day is also conducted in the village almost every year, but however, sometimes the women are being invited when the department is unable to conduct in the village. Often the students of anthropology are taken to visit the village. During Corona Pandemic the department of Anthropology conduct the Vaccination camp and provide free mask to villagers.

The village Halodhipara is adopted by the department of anthropology since 2021. It is a homogeneous village inhabited the Rabhas and the Bodos community. Village adoption means to work along with the community at the grass root level, while empowering them for pursuing the goal of development of the village in line with the sustainable development goals and learning as to what works and what doesn't and evolve a model of the village development for replication.

According to the census 2011 information the location code or village code of Mugakhal village is 303036. Mugakhal village is located under the Boko circle, Dist. Kamrup(Assam). It is adjacent to Jawaharlal Nehru College, Boko. It is situated 62 km away from Sub-divisional & District Head quarter Guwahati. It fall under the 69 no Dakhin PachimBoko GaonPanchayat under the Boko Development Block. The total geographical area of the village is 156.79 hectares. It has a total population of 500. Out of it 254 is male and 246 is female till 30th March ,2022. There are 102 household in the Mugakhal village.
