Since its inception in 1964, the College has fervidly and persistently followed its motto of creation of a sound mind in a sound body.

In the illuminating and inspiring words of the late scientist turned statesman, Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam, "We are all born with a divine fire in us. Our effort should be to give wings to this fire and fill the world with the glow of its goodness." [Wings of Fire- APJ Abdul Kalam]. And it is the divine fire which has been burning bright in the brigade of the faculty of Jawaharlal Nehru College to strive continuously in the path of knowledge acquisition, preservation and propagation among students and the community as well as bolster each with wings of fire and spread the goodness of remarkable erudition with an equal thrust towards the holistic development as well.

Indeed it is this divine fire which has been relentlessly inspiring the Jawaharlal Nehru College family to widen the horizon of capacity and knowledge dissemination by introducing the post graduate studies in the dept. of Assamese and Mathematics.

The message to students here at Jawaharlal Nehru College is "To succeed in life and achieve results, you must understand and master three mighty forces- desire, belief, and expectation." [Wings of Fire- APJ Abdul Kalam].

Therefore with deep faith and belief in ourselves, we are undaunted in the path of progress of our College with the invaluable co-operation, association of various communities in Boko in our effort to achieve higher and nobler goals.

With these words, I welcome all the aspirant students to become a proud member of the Jawaharlal Nehru College fraternity.

Brief History of the College:

During the early sixties, the ideas of opening an institution of higher education in the remote part of South Kamrup came to the mind of the people of Boko area Late Prabin Kumar Choudhury, the then Minister of Transport, Assam, who represented the Boko Constituency of the Assam Assembly and Late Achyut Kanta Adhikary took the leading role in the establishment of a college at Boko and he was given the charge as part time honorary In-charge Principal & Secretary on 1st August 1964. In the long run, the college came in to existence on 3rd August, 1964 and named it after the hallowed memory of Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru, independent India's first Prime Minister who had breathed his last on 27th May in that year. The liberal policy of the Gauhati University in granting the affiliation to colleges of rural areas extended a positive support

of this institution to emerge. Under the stewardships of Prabin Kumar Choudhury and Achyut Kanta Adhikary, the institution has made remarkable progress. His Excellency the Governor of Assam was pleased to allot 100 bighas of land (33 acre approx.) for the college at Jarapara V.G.R., two km west of Boko Police Station on the northern side of NH-37. On 1st of September 1965, Mr. J.C. Nath took over the charge of full time Principal of the institution and served the college till 31st May 1995. Thereafter, the college received 1st Degree Affiliation in the year 1967 from the Gauhati University. The Arts stream received Deficit Grants in Aid on 1st September 1969. The college was provincialized from 1st December 2005. The Science stream was started in the year 1986 and on received Deficit Grants in Aid o 25th March 1998.

From its inception the college has traversed a steady course towards expanding its academic and infrastructural needs. At present there are 14 departments with honours, nine in Arts stream and five in Science stream. Beyond that the college has initiated PG courses in Assamese and Mathematics, Post Graduate Diploma in Computer Application, some career oriented and vocational courses to cater to the needs of the students of the locality.

At present the college has grown up into a full-fledged well-known institution with academic excellence and co-curricular activities, particularly in the field of games and sports, culture, literature and social activities. The college is going to celebrate its glorious Diamond Jubilee year from August, 2023. To identify its strengths and weaknesses in the present-day context the college has got itself accredited by the NAAC for its third cycle this year and accorded with B++ grade. After receiving the prestigious Star Status from the DBT, Govt. of India in 2019, our college has set a benchmark and became the first college of Assam to receive Star Status from the Department of Biotechnology Govt. of India. To equip our youths with 21st Century skill, the college is planning to establish a “Remote Pilot Training Organization” (Drone Pilot training) Centre in collaboration with NECTAR, a Govt. of India organization to start DDCA approved Certificate Course from this academic Session.

From the academic session 2023-24, Four Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUP) under Gauhati University have been introduced in the line of NEP 2020 and admission will be done through the SAMARTH- e suit platform introduced by the MoE, Govt of India.

Location : The college is situated at a distance of 60 kilometers west of Guwahati. The college is well connected with Guwahati, the capital of Assam by road and railway services. The cardinal point of the college is 25.57⁰ North and 91.12⁰ East. The college is standing on the National Highway No. 17. The interstate boundary between Assam and Meghalaya is just 10 km south of the college and Chamaria, a village of Vaishnavite culture is located at 13 k.m. North. The inter district boundary between Kamrup and Goalpara is a distance of 10 k.m. West of the college.

College Emblem : The burning flame at the center of the emblem represents the spreading of knowledge. The rose above the basement of the emblem represents the fragrance of wisdom. The

name of the college is engraved on the circumference of the emblem. The motto of the college is encrypted in Sanskrit “Saa vidya ya vimuktye’ means education is that which liberates.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

ADMISSION IN H.S. PROGRAMME UNDER AHSEC

Admission procedure is purely online. An applicant has to go through the following steps to apply online-

Step 1 : An applicant has to visit DARPAN portal of AHSEC and to apply for admission giving necessary information. They have to select Jawaharlal Nehru College in the college name. Our college will select students from the DARPAN portal as per capacity of the college in each stream. The merit list prepared through DARPAN will be displayed in the college website/portal and admission will be held as per date, venue and time to be declared by the college in notice board and in the college web portal www.jncollegeonline.co.in.

Moreover students have to apply in the college online portal also. For this they have to visit the college website www.jncollegeboko.ac.in. Then click on “Online portal” button available in the website. A new page will open up where the applicant has to click “Apply Online”.

Step 2 : The applicant should click “New Enrolment” and when new window will open up he/she will have to register by filling up required fields. The applicant should have a valid Email ID (preferably at Gmail) and a mobile number for registration. Login by using your mobile number as user ID and giving your own pass word. Only One mobile number can use by one applicant.

Step 3 : After successful registration the applicant will have to fill up the admission form as per his/her requirement. Along with other details he/she should put bank accounts details like Bank name, branch, account numbers, IFSC.

Step 4 : Then he/she has to upload his/her passport size photograph and scanned signature there.

Step 5 : The he/she should upload scanned copies of following documents :

- Last examination Mark-sheet.
- Last examination Certificate.
- Caste Certificate
- NCC/Extra Curricular Certificate (Where applicable)
- Front page of Bank Passbook/ Cheque
- Gap certificate (Where applicable)
- Migration Certificate (For applicant of other states)

Step 6 : Before final submission the applicant will review the filled data for any necessary modification. If any correction/modification needed he/she will make the correction and then submit the form by clicking “Final Submission” button. Applicant should remember that once submitted there is no scope of correction of filled data.

Rules & Regulations of the College

The affiliating University has introduced semester system CBCS in its undergraduate course from 2019. This course will be conducted as per the regulations of the Gauhati University as reproduced below :

- The three year degree course will be of six semesters covering three calendar years.
- Classes of 1st, 3rd and 5th semesters will commence from June to November every year.
- Classes of 2nd, 4th and 6th semester will commence from December to May every year.
- 1st July to 31st July will be the period of semester break. Students' performance will be monitored throughout the semesters by continuous assessment and evaluation in the theory and practical courses on the basis of the following:

Internal evaluation- 20% marks

External evaluation- 80% marks

- e) Internal evaluation will be done based on class attendance, sessional examination, Home assignment, seminar and library works.
- f) External evaluation will be done on the basis of a final examination conducted by the affiliating university at the end of every semester.
- g) A student who could not appear or failed in any semester will be allowed to clear the same as follows :
 - First semester with the regular third semester examination.
 - Second semester with the regular fourth semester examination.
 - Third semester with regular fifth semester examination.
 - Fourth semester with the regular sixth semester examination.
- h) A student is allowed to reappear in the theory papers in the first, second and third semester if the student secures less than 45% marks in the concerned paper.
- i) No repeat/ betterment is allowed in practical examination in any semester.
- j) A student must pass all the semester examinations including repeat and betterment chances within five years from the date of admission to the first semester.
- k) A student is allowed maximum three chances to clear a particular semester. No student is allowed to appear as private candidate.
- l) A student must appear and pass in each subject in the sessional examination conducted by the college. Evaluated scripts are sent to the University for verification.

Rules Relating to Examination

1. For the continuous evaluation of the students, the college conducts four sessional examinations in an academic session. Appearance of the students in the examinations is mandatory and 20% of marks secured in these examinations will be added in the final examination.
2. Students who do not appear in the sessional test are not allowed to appear in the final examination.
3. Mobile phone and any electronic gadgets are strictly prohibited in the examination hall.
4. Admit Card, Registration Card, Identity Card are compulsory to produce in the examination hall.
5. College authority will take disciplinary action against any unfair means adopted by students in the examination hall.

Attendance Rule

1. Attendance in classes is mandatory. A student must attend at least 75% of the classes held, failing which he/she will be declared as non-collegiate student and will not be allowed to seat in their respective examinations.
2. Non-collegiate student will also forfeit the benefit of scholarship .
3. A student absent from classes continuously for 15 days or more without any valid reason shall forfeit his/her studentship.

Students Discipline

All Rules and Regulations for Higher Secondary, Degree and Masters Degree will be followed as per the guidelines of AHSEC/ Gauhati University.

(a) Discipline : The college authority maintains the following Disciplines among the students :

- i. Wearing of complete college uniform is compulsory.

College Central Library :

Jawaharlal Nehru College has a modern computerized college library. The library has an impressive collection of books, journals, newspapers, magazines, e-Books, e-Journal, manuscript, Rare Books and bibliographic databases etc. The library also provides access to e-resources to the teachers and students of the college through UGC-INFLIBNET N-LIST programme along with institutional access to National Digital Library of India. The library remains open from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. on all working days. It follows Open Access System and enjoys Library Automation with SOUL 20 Software, Wi-Fi facility is also available in the library. The College Library has introduced Book Bank facilities to needy and deserving students who may borrow books for the whole academic session.

Library Rules

1. Each student is issued two library cards for an academic session. Two more Library Cards is given to students with honours subjects.
2. No book is issued without Identity Card.
3. Only one book is issued against one card.
4. Books are issued only for a period of 15 days. At the expiry of the stipulated period the user will have to get reissued the same book from the library.
5. Non return of books after stipulated period will attract a fine of Rs. 0.50 per day.
6. An user will have to bring any damage of the book to the notice of the library staff at the time of receipt.
7. At the event of damage or loss of book at the custody of the user, the user has to borne the market price or replace the same with new one.

8. The students will have to return all the library books along with their library cards before one week of the commencement of each B.A./ B.Sc. semester and H.S. 1st and 2nd year final examinations Students must collect library clearance certificate to receive **Admit Card**.
9. For duplicate library card, a sum of Rs. 50 will be charged.
10. Library reading room facility can be availed by the students after submission of their identity card.
11. Documentation of reading materials can be done in the library at the payment of necessary fee at the counter of the library as fixed by the authority.
12. The decision of the college authority in any matter relating to library is final and binding.

Departmental Library :

All the departments of the college have their own departmental library from which students can borrow books complying with the rules laid down by the concerned department.

Infrastructure and Facilities

Digital Class Rooms :

The college is equipped with two audio-visual digital class rooms with all modern teaching facilities.

Laboratories :

With the financial support from University Grant Commission, departmental Laboratories are set up with all modern equipment's and amenities. For the convenience of the students, laboratories are connected with digital generator for uninterrupted power supply.

Advanced Level Bio-Tech. Hub

Jawaharlal Nehru College has established an Institutional Biotech-Hub in January, 2011 with well equipped laboratory and infrastructural facilities for teaching-learning and carrying out research in the field of Biology/Biotechnology. It was sponsored by DBT Govt. of India and implemented by North Eastern Region, Biotechnology Programme Management Centre (NER-BPMC), through Biotechnology Consortium India Limited (BCIL). After regular monitoring based on performance the DBT has been promoted to the Biotech Hub I the session 2016-17 with additional equipment and manpower grant.

Museum

Departments of Anthropology, Botany and Zoology have been maintaining departmental museums with good number of precious collections of material culture and specimens.

Network Resource Centre

The college has set up a Network Resource Centre with Internet facilities for teachers and students.

Computer Lab

The college has a computer laboratory in collaboration with NIELIT, Guwahati, under Department of Electronics & Information Technology, Ministry of Communication and Information Technology, Govt. of India to extend IT facility for the college fraternity.

Star Status Scheme

Five science departments Mathematics, Botany, Chemistry, Physics and Zoology of the college have come under DBT Star Status Scheme from 2019. Earlier these five departments received grants under DBT Star College scheme for more than three years. Degree students of science can avail various facilities like Laboratory visits, Field Visits, Seminars, Student Resources Project etc. under this scheme.

Women's Hostel

70 bedded hostel facility is available in this college for girl students only. Admission is purely on merit basis.

Language Lab

The college has a well equipped language Laboratory under the Department of English for the development of the language skills of students as well as teachers.

G.I.S. Lab

To facilitate advance research activities in Geo informatics and other disciplines, the college is equipped with a G.I.S. laboratory for academic and research purposes.

Weather Station

Aryabhata Science Centre of Boko Block was established in 2011 under the Department of Physics which is catalysed by ASTEC, Govt. of Assam and funded by Department of Science and Technology Govt. of India. The activities of the centre are taken up in the interior parts of the Boko Development Block to create awareness of science education among students at secondary level through the practice of 'learning by doing' method and thereby promote scientific temperament among rural masses and consequently avail benefits of Science and Technology in their day to day life. Students are encouraged to take up activity based programmes and there by facilitating them to participate in national level Science and Technology programmes.

Rover and Ranger Units

Rover and Ranger unit of the college, under Bharat Scout and Guide, Assam has been participating in different creative events organized in the college as well as outside the state. The purpose of the movement is to develop young people as responsible citizen committed to the service of the mankind. So far, the volunteers of the unit have made us proud bagging a number of prizes in different events organized outside the state.
