About the College:

Jawaharlal Nehru College is located in Boko, a remote area of South Kamrup, Assam, adjacent to National Highway No.37, approximately 65 km from Guwahati. The college was established on August 3, 1964, and received its first-degree affiliation in 1967 from Gauhati University. The Arts stream was granted Deficit Grants-in-Aid on September 1, 1969. The college was provincialized on December 1, 2005. The Science stream was initiated in 1986 and received Deficit Grants-in-Aid on March 25, 1998. The institution has been registered under sections 2(f) and 12(B) of the UGC Act of 1956 since September 26, 1969. Currently, the college has developed into a well-respected institution known for its academic excellence and a wide range of co-curricular activities, particularly in sports, culture, literature, and social initiatives. In 2014, the college celebrated its 50th anniversary. To assess its strengths and weaknesses, the college has been accredited by NAAC in 2004, 2014, and again in 2023, achieving grades of 'C++', 'B', and 'B++', respectively. In 2019, the college achieved the prestigious Star Status from the Department of Biotechnology, Government of India, becoming the first college in Assam to receive this honour on September 19, 2019. Since 2011, the college has been following a three-year degree course under a semester system, and in the academic session 2019-20, the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) was introduced, as prescribed by the affiliating university. Additionally, a four-year degree course was launched in 2023. The college has a Women's Hostel

located on campus, adjacent to the main playground, with a seating capacity of 75 and with extension plan of the hostel which would add a greater number of seats are going to be introduced. The construction of a Boys hostel with capacity of 25 boarders is underway with sanction of Rupees 1Cr from Directorate Of Welfare of Plain Tribes and Backward Classes. This facility enables girls from remote and rural areas to pursue higher education. With respect to the post-graduate program in the HEI, department of Mathematics and Assamese are successfully running the programs since its inception.

Present status: The institution spans 33 acres and boasts a robust infrastructure that supports teaching, learning, knowledge dissemination, and skill development for students from Boko and beyond. In alignment with government policy, the college offers free education. Underprivileged students receive assistance in the form of books, reading materials, and essential academic support to help them continue their higher education. As the student population has grown, the college has enhanced its facilities, including the addition of an audio-visual classroom for the Departments of Botany, Chemistry, Mathematics, and Zoology, as well as upgrades to the existing Physics laboratory. All classrooms are equipped with CCTV, and additional features include Wi-Fi access, a fully digitized ICT facility, and a video conferencing room with audio-visual resources for viewing the Edusat Program. Furthermore, the college has established a new Boys' Common Room and Union Office, along with an additional Girls' Common Room. The restrooms for both boys and girls have also been renovated. Additionally, five new pieces of laboratory equipment have been added to improve the facilities. The college features various facilities to promote student co-curricular activities, including the Warden Quarter hostel, the Dr. Bhupen Hazarika Memorial Open Stage, an outdoor stadium, a swimming pool, a synthetic volleyball court, and open playgrounds. Indoor sports facilities are also available. Continuous support for student engagement in sports and games is provided through the Gilbertson Sangma Outdoor Stadium (donated by the Rabha Hasong Autonomous Council), the Bhogeswar Baruah Indoor Mini Stadium, a gymnasium, and the Prabin Kumar Choudhury Memorial Swimming Pool. The college aims to foster holistic development among students by offering life skill development programs through the Yoga Centre and Cultural Unit. The Dr. Bhupen Hazarika Xuoroni Mukoli Mansa serves as a venue for showcasing student talents through events such as Creative Adda, debates, discussions, extempore speech practice and competitions, and play presentations. Additionally, the college encourages student involvement in the promotion and preservation of local culture, as well as intellectual and research activities. This is organized under the Cultural Unit and the Dr. Bhupen Hazarika Centre for Culture and Creative Studies, with the Anthropology department acting as the nodal department in collaboration with the Assamese, Bodo, and History departments. The institution consistently arranges a variety of activities

under these initiatives to support and promote holistic development, preparing students to provide quality service to the nation.

In view of the upholding the collaborative spirit and harnessing viable opportunities in the field of academics, research and development as well as faculty and student exchange programmes the college has signed significant MoU s with Down Town University, and The Royal Global University in the recent times. The college is now offering the Integrated Teacher Education Program (ITEP) B.A, B.Ed, and B.Sc B.Ed equivalent to an Undergraduate Degree from the session 2025-2026. Also courses like BCA, Physical Education will very soon be introduced in the course curriculum.

Under the mission Amrit Sarovar nurturing an objective of conserving water, the mission targeted in developing 75 Amrit Sarovars in each district of the country. Our college holds the privilege of developing one such Sarovar. Not only with an aim of fishery but for developing agro forestry work, the college is gradually developing the area with an aim of boosting self-sustained economy after the successful implementation of the Rubber Garden within college enclosure.

To meet specialized demands of 21st century skills, under North East Centre for Technology Application and Research (NECTAR), the Drone Pilot Training School has been opened. Subsequent trainings are in the pipeline as per the directive. In a bid to develop the college-community sustainable link and introducing designed skill development plans in tandem with national ‘Amritnirbhar Bharat’, the college for the intent of growing as a self-sustaining institute developed a Banana Fibre Processing under NECTAR which has begun its production successfully.

It is a matter of pride for our college and the locality at large that under the Directorate of Cultural Affairs, Govt. of Assam, a cultural centre for the promotion and sustenance of the rich and vibrant culture of the area and Assam, the Bishnujyoti Cultural Centre is already underway. Further, as per the NEP-2020 system, a mandatory internship program is to be undertaken. For FYUGP 3rd semester students, the college has collaborated with NIELIT to offer this course, scheduled to commence immediately after the end-semester examination.

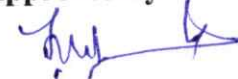
