*to attain socio-economic gains by the groups. Autonomy has become one of the major concerns of the tribal groups. In Northeast India, there are many demands for separate states for the tribal groups. Assam is specially known for its diversity. It has different nationalities and tribal group living together in this region for centuries. While some of these tribes have assimilated into the Assamese culture, there are others who are determined to retain their unique identity. Now, once again, the threat of further reduction of the size and autonomy has sharpened in the wake of new movements launched by various tribal groups in the plains and the hills after the Asom Gana Parishad has come to power. Bodo movement of Assam started as a socio cultural movement but later an emergent political movement of the Bodo tribe.*
